Sessions are 50 minutes and focus on emotional recovery, resilience, and empowerment. You'll help clients move through the **Akima Pathway** — **Awareness** → **Kinship** → **Insight** → **Mindset** → **Achievement** — using your chosen therapeutic approach and **Akima's trauma-informed** model.

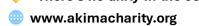
